3. Degree is unit for measuring latitude and longitude.
4. The area of the earth south of the Equator to the South Pole is the Southern Hemisphere.
5. The area of the earth north of the Equator to the North Pole is the Northern Hemisphere.
6. Another name for a line of longitude is meridian.
7. Relative location is used to describe a place in relation to other places. For example, Middle America is between South America and North America.
8. Lines of latitude are called parallels, because all points on any single line are the same distance from the Equator.
9. The equator is the longest line of latitude, ringing the earth at its middle.
10. Latitude and longitude are used to identify the absolute location of a place.
