

# Jungle Jive

## Lesson #10

### Behavioral Issue:

Does not follow verbal directions

### Objective:

- Students will have a better understanding of the importance of following directions.
- Students will demonstrate the ability to follow verbal directions by listening carefully and completing the task.

### Materials:

Jungle Jive by Julie Woik

Letter size paper

Print out the form that correlates with this lesson

### Activity:

Read the Jungle Jive book to the child/children who will be participating in this activity. Talk about how following directions comes into play for everyone, including the characters in this story. Explain how following directions helps us get things done, whether it's completing a project, doing our homework, or exercising in a group. Help the children understand that completing the tasks we have in our lives, keeps us in balance, and sometimes that involves someone else giving the directions. It's always important to be respectful to the person who's giving the directions. Learning how to properly listen and follow directions, will help us learn how to express and give direction.

### Assessment:

Students will recognize the significance of following verbal directions. They'll see a connection between following directions and getting things done. This activity will help them gain a respect for directions, and in time, learn to be a leader.
