

Jungle Jive

Lesson #3

Behavioral Issue:

Makes unnecessary physical contact with others

Objective:

- Students will learn to make physical contact with others when appropriate.
- Students will recognize the appropriate interaction to initiate for any given situation.

Materials:

Jungle Jive by Julie Woik

Heavy stock paper

Print out the choices that correlate with this lesson

Activity:

Read the Jungle Jive book to the child/children who will be participating in this activity. After the reading, talk about what happened in the story when no one paid attention to keeping balance in the environment. Discuss how things began to fall apart and how the villagers became unhappy. Put all of the posters on the wall or lay on a table. Give the child/children scenarios in which they need to choose an appropriate reaction. Explain how our responses to situations matter. We can upset the balance of everyone and everything around us if we don't choose acceptable behavior. Make the RIGHT Connection!!!

Assessment:

Students will understand the importance of appropriate contact with others in different circumstances. They will be able to demonstrate acceptable physical contact such as a handshake, a high five, or even handing over a note of praise.
