# The Kacklin' Kitchen Lesson #6



#### Behavioral Issue:

Behaves inappropriately when others do well or receive praise or attention (can't stand to lose in a game/it's all unfair)

## Objective:

- Students will realize the value to praising others.
- Students will congratulate others when they do well.

### Materials:

The Kacklin' Kitchen by Julie Woik Print out the form that correlates with this lesson

## Activity:

Read The Kacklin' Kitchen with the child or children who are participating in this activity. After the reading, review the second last page of the story; where Mookee MaGee expresses how sorry he is to everyone, and then discuss how the others shake his hand, except his apology, and respect him for doing the right thing. Talk about the importance of respecting someone by verbally congratulating them, giving them a high-five, or shaking their hand. Have the child/children write a song, rap, or whimsical poem in which they voice respect for another person/s who has accomplished something. Showing pride for someone else, will give us pride inside ourself!!

## Assessment:

Students will appreciate their peers for doing a good job or completing a project; and they'll respect their hard work and feel the benefit of cheering them on. In turn, they'll gain respect from their classmates and those around them for offering their support and encouragement.
