

The Kacklin' Kitchen

Lesson #7



Behavioral Issue:

Demonstrates inappropriate behavior when moving with a group (fails to stay in line, runs, pushes, etc.)

Objective:

- Students will learn to follow the rules in a group setting.
- Students will be respectful when moving in a group.

Materials:

The Kacklin' Kitchen by Julie Woik

Print out the form that correlates with this lesson

Magazines or Newspapers/Scissors

Colored pencils or Markers or Colors

Activity:

Read The Kacklin' Kitchen with the child or children who are participating in this activity. After the reading, ask them if they think the other characters in the story were upset by such things as Mookie MaGee pushing Bubba the Bread. Discuss how it feels when someone pushes someone else, runs when they're told not to, or won't stay in line to be one of the group. Once you've gone over how disrespectful this is to others, have the child/children create a badge or button they can wear, which shows or states what respectful behavior in a group, is about.

Assessment:

Students will acknowledge their inappropriate behavior in a group and recognize the benefit of following rules for everyone's sake. They'll learn how good it feels to give and gain respect through proper conduct.
