
This is what happened ...

Use heavy stock paper to print the cards. Cut them out, putting the happy faces in one section, and the unhappy faces in another. Turn over all of the cards. Take turns going first. Choose a card from the unhappy pile. Look at the character and describe what kind of disrespectful incident you think might have occurred to make that character unhappy. Then have the other person choose a card from the happy pile. Now describe how the incident was turned around by that character, using respectful solutions. You may even end up choosing the same character. Figure out what might have happened to change that character's behavior.
