Objective:

- Students will use listening and viewing strategies to identify specific details regarding a work of literature.
- Students will use their speaking strategies to ask questions and seek answers regarding basic elements that make up a picture book.

Materials:

The Kacklin' Kitchen by Julie Woik
Colors, Markers, or Pencils
Print out form that correlates with this lesson.
Optional - Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson.

Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read The Kacklin' Kitchen, showing everyone the illustrations. After the reading, hand out the form which challenges students to identify and connect the various elements of a book such as the author, the illustrator, the title, and the main character.

Assessment:

Students will increase their knowledge of various components associated with a book; specifically a picture book. They will identify words and construct meaning from illustrations.
