

The Kacklin' Kitchen

Lesson #5



Age:
Kindergarten

Objective:

- Students will construct meaning and determine the main idea or essential message from a work of literature.
- Students will understand the power of language, and will recognize that the use of other mediums increases the power to influence how one thinks and feels.

Materials:

The Kacklin' Kitchen by Julie Woik

Colors, Markers, or Pencils

Finger Paints - Various colors

Print out form that correlates with this lesson.

Optional - Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson.

Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read *The Kacklin' Kitchen*, showing everyone the illustrations. After the reading, discuss the lesson of RESPECT being taught in this story. Explain the meaning of respect and how each student can show it to one another. Then hand out the form in which students can make a poster promising to do their best to practice respect.

Assessment:

Students will use their personal perspectives to respond to a work of literature, such as relating characters in a story to events in their own lives.
