
The Kacklin' Kitchen Lesson #1



Age: Pre-Kindergarten

Objective:

• Students will use their personal perspective in responding to a work of literature, and recognize that people see things in different ways.

Materials:

The Kacklin' Kitchen by Julie Woik Colors. Markers. or Color Pencils Print out form that correlates with this lesson. Optional – Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson. See attached *Letter for Parents*

Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read The Kacklin' Kitchen, showing everyone the illustrations. After the reading, hand out the line art form of Mookee MaGee. Have the students color him the way they would like him to look. While the children are coloring, take the opportunity to talk about what it means to respect yourself and others. Discuss the ways respect is exchanged right there in your classroom.

Assessment:

Students recognize their personal perspective by coloring the character as they would like him to appear.
