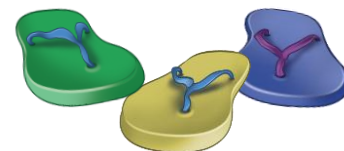


Ocean Commotion

Age:

Objective:

- Students will analyze and compare objects.
- Students will recognize patterns related to physical characteristics.
- Students will visualize ways in which shapes perform geometric transformations through flips and turns.

Materials:

Ocean Commotion by Julie Woik

Pencils, Markers, or Colored Pencils

Print out form that correlates with this lesson.

Optional - Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson.

Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read *Ocean Commotion*, showing everyone the detailed illustrations. After the reading, hand out the form in which students will study the first pattern. After studying the pattern, they'll correctly identify and select the pattern that is identical to the sample, from the three choices provided.

Assessment:

Students will analyze and identify various objects different in shape, color, and number. They will organize data in order to understand patterns and relationships using objects.
