Ocean Commotion Lesson #1



Behavioral Issue:

Is not accepted by others

Objective:

- Students will recognize inappropriate behavior.
- Students will demonstrate behaviors that will be accepted by others.

Materials:

Ocean Commotion by Julie Woik Crayons, Colored Pencils, Markers, and a Pencil Print out the forms that correlate with this lesson

Activity:

Read Ocean Commotion with the child or children who are participating in this activity. After the reading, talk about Echo's behavior, and how it made others in the town feel. Discuss the importance of one's behavior when belonging to a group, and how certain rules of conduct need to be followed in order to get along with others. Now have the student's draw the picture of them interacting with others. Then have them answer the questions. After answering the questions, have them review the behavior choices and pick the ones they feel are best. Now discuss those choices and implement them.

Assessment:

Students will develop appropriate ways to interact with peers. They'll learn to make positive choices in group settings, and will engage in socially acceptable behaviors such as utilizing a normal tone of voice and quietly awaiting their turn.
