## Objective:

- Students will recognize the different ways numbers are represented and used.
- Students will use comparisons to sort objects into subgroups that vary by one or more attributes.


## Materials:

Ocean Commotion by Julie Woik
Pencils, Markers, or Colored Pencils
Print out form that correlates with this lesson.
Optional - Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson. See attached Letter for Parents

## Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read Ocean Commotion, showing everyone the detailed illustrations. After the reading, hand out the form in which students will count the number of bubbles that compare to the example given. They will write the total at the bottom. You may also have the students write a number in each of the bubbles: 1-2-3 and so forth.

## Assessment:

Students will demonstrate their ability to recognize differences in size, as well as showing their understanding of basic numbers in relation to quantity.
