
The Little Building

Age: Kindergarten



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Objective:

- Students will enhance their cognitive thinking.
- Students will improve their motor and visual skills.
- Students will increase their hand/eye coordination.
- Students will learn to find solutions.

Materials:

The Little Building by Julie Woik Pencils, Colors, Markers, or Color Pencils Print out form that correlates with this lesson. Optional - Send home letter to parents regarding this lesson. See attached *Letter for Parents*

Activity:

Gather the children in a circle and read The Little Building, showing everyone the illustrations. After the reading, discuss how Boomer struggled with being responsible. Talk about how valuable it is when someone follows through with something they've committed to. Then hand out the form for this activity. Have the students "follow through" and make the decision to complete the path for Boomer.

Assessment:

Students will use their newly enhanced cognitive skills to think, learn, read, and remember. They'll be able to process information and turn it into knowledge. This kind of knowledge will help them make decisions and take action.
